Syllabus

The aim of this course is to study the essential institutions and basis of commercial law as a branch of the legal system which regulates entrepreneurs and their activities in the marketplace.

To this end, the course critically examines and focuses especially on the principles and basic rules of the legal status of entrepreneurs (commercial register; company representation and accounting); groups of proprietors and especially capital company law (legal position of partners, regulatory capital regime, structure of governing bodies, etc.); competition law especially the law on unfair competition and the legal protection of industrial property, in particular trademark law, and finally bankruptcy proceedings, particularly the notion of insolvency, asset and liability determination and solutions.
